








River Herring in the Food Chain





River Herring Vocab


Anadromous

<u>Iteroparous</u>

spawn multiple times in life

Natal homing

- return (usually) to the river or pond they were born in
- potential mates are from one river system

- Coloring tools (pens, crayons, markers, etc.)






